Why Recycle?

* Americans produce over 207 million tons of solid waste each year.

Recycling saves landfill space!

* For every 4 foot stack of newspaper produced, a 17 foot pine tree is used.

Recycling conserves natural resources!

* Recycling aluminum saves 95% of the energy required to make aluminum from raw materials.

Recycling saves energy!

* Using recycled paper reduces pollution involved in the paper making process by 95%.

Recycling reduces pollution!

* Many local groups are directly involved in the recycling effort in Henry County.

Recycling promotes community spirit!

* We have local companies that depend on your involvement in recycling.

Recycling employs people!

* Some recyclables have market value.

Recycling earns money!

* Less bags of garbage and waste are produced when you recycle.

Recycling saves money!

What is Recyclable?

* **Metal:** Includes household items like beverage cans and steel or tin cans. Just rinse and recycle.

* **Cardboard:** Remove all non-cardboard material. This does not include wax-coated boxes, milk cartons or containers with metal ends or rings.

* **Plastics:** Items clearly marked with recycling symbols #1 or #2. Only plastic that is thinner at the top than at the bottom. Empty, rinse and replace caps.

* **Newspapers:** Stack into paper grocery bags or tie into bundles. No plastic bags, wet paper, magazines, catalogs or phone books.

* **Magazines, Catalogs, Phone Books:** Place in paper grocery bags. No plastic bags. These are not accepted at all sites.

General Recycling Guidelines

- * No oil or anti-freeze containers
 - * No styrofoam, including egg cartons
 - * Separate materials in advance
 - * Place materials in proper receptacles
 - * No plastic bags, leave material loose
 - * No clear or colored glass

Buy Recycled!

* We also need to purchase items made from recycled content material. It is very simple. Look for the highest percentage of post-consumer content on the label.

Here are a few examples of items that can be made from recycled material:

* Paper Products: Writing and typing paper, envelopes, paper towels, bath and facial tissue and paper board boxes.

* Steel Products: Steel is the most recycled material we have.

* Aluminum Beverage Cans and Plastic Bottles

* Others: Sleeping bags, carpet, shoes, insulation, motor oil, pencils, tile, rulers and mats. This list is never-ending.
